



SUPER SUDOKU!

To solve a sudoku puzzle you must place the numbers 1-9 once and only once in each row, in each column and in each 3x3 block.

An example:

Hints: Find a line or square that's almost full. Look at the numbers already used in the row, column and block. None of those can be repeated. More difficult Sudoku puzzles have more squares and fewer starting clues. Careful reasoning and patient guesswork are required to complete them.
